UW Textual Studies

Minor in Textual Studies and Digital Humanities

The history, present and future of texts, from scrolls, manuscripts and printed books to archival documents, digital texts and textual data. Study how texts have been written, published, read, circulated and archived from antiquity to today. Coursework offers hands-on work with historical texts, archival sources, and artists' books, and with methods for editing, digitizing and publishing texts, as well as for building and analyzing text-oriented databases and archives.

Consider this minor if you're thinking about careers or further studies in publishing and editing, libraries and library science, archives and cultural institutions, or in contexts that involve working with cultural, literary and historical texts in digital and archival environments.
