UW Textual Studies Minor in Textual Studies and Digital Humanities



Interested in the history and future of reading and writing? Fascinated by how technologies shape the ways we record, preserve, and access texts and information, from the stone tablets and scrolls of antiquity to medieval manuscripts and printed books, to the screens, AI algorithms, and massive digital repositories like Google Books that shape our access to texts, information, and cultural archives today? Thinking about a career in libraries and archives or in publishing and editing, or in a field dedicated to preserving and making accessible cultural materials and documents?

Courses in the Textual Studies and Digital Humanities minor emphasize hands-on, project-oriented experiences, working with artifacts such as hand-printed books and manuscripts, archival documents, and artists books; learning best practices and using tools to digitize materials and to publish digital editions and exhibits; and developing the critical and technical skills to build, analyze and understand text-oriented databases like Google Books.
