## Fellowship Types and Amounts





## **Eligibility**

Students must be:

- Citizens, nationals, or permanent residents of the United States; and
- A current or incoming UW student
- Studying one of the UW FLAS languages

Undergraduate students must be at the intermediate or advanced level of study of a less commonly taught language.

Graduate students must be at the intermediate or advanced level of language study (or have advanced proficiency in another language related to their field to qualify for first year language study).

## **Eligible Languages at UW**

Bangla, Burmese, Chinese, Hindi, Indonesian, Inuktut, Japanese, Khmer, Korean, Persian, Tagalog, Thai, Urdu, Vietnamese.

French available to graduate students only (must be at intermediate or advanced level).

How to Apply

Four Title VI National Resource Centers at the University of Washington distribute FLAS fellowships: the Canadian Studies Center, East Asia Center, South Asia Center, and Southeast Asia Center. Students apply online via the application portal. Applications are reviewed by each Center's FLAS selection committee.

Deadline: Both Summer 2024 and AY 2024-25 applications open November 1, 2023 and close January 31, 2024 at 5:00 p.m. PST.
