The Building A Movement (BAM) Labor Internship is a PAID internship program that connects undergraduate students at the University of Washington with the local labor movement, through partnerships with community organizations engaged with this work on a variety of levels.

Build connections and relationships with leaders and activists in labor.

Learn about the history of labor organizing.

Develop meaningful professional and leadership skills.

Create and engage in spaces that discuss how our efforts can collectively contribute to the broader labor movement and the systemic liberation of all working (and non-working) peoples.

HOURS, PAY AND ACADEMIC CREDIT

Students hours vary between 4 and 19.5 hours per week, depending on their host organization, including weekly 1.5 hour meetings with other BAM interns. Students will be compensated at a rate of \$22/hr, which includes their hours spent working with their host organization and a weekly meeting with other BAM Labor Interns. Academic credit available if interested.
