### **Apply for a Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship**

Did you know that the U.S. Department of Education funds Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) fellowships for students to study foreign languages and area studies?

### **Eligibility**

Students must be:

- citizens, nationals, or permanent residents of the United States; and
- a current or incoming UW student; and
- studying one of the UW FLAS languages.

## **UW FLAS languages**

- Bangla
- Khmer
- Burmese
- Korean
- Chinese
- Persian
- French\*
- Tagalog
- Hindi
- Thai
- Indonesian
- Urdu
- Inuktut
- Vietnamese
- Japanese

\*Only graduate students may study French; study must be at second-year level or higher

### Important: language levels

Fellowship awards are intended for second-year language study or higher (no first-year study).

- No exceptions possible for undergraduates
- Graduate students may apply for first-year if they hold advanced proficiency in another foreign language related to their field
