## **Course Description:**

Considers unique properties and processes occurring in forest soils throughout the world with emphasis on soils of Pacific Northwest and aspects of forest soils that affect productivity. Two all-day field trips required, Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### **Duties and Requirements**

Applicants must have a strong background in Pacific Northwest ecology including plant identification and it is strongly preferred that applicants have taken at least one soils course (e.g., ESRM 210, 311) prior to Spring 2023. The duties include collecting plant and soil samples, helping to set up for each of the lab sessions, and assisting in the field trips. *It may be necessary to drive a UW van for the field trips. If so, UW Driver Safety Training and First Aid training are required*.

Applicants must be making satisfactory progress.
