

## **Hourly Field Trip Support – ESRM 201 – Sustaining Pacific Northwest Ecosystems**

### **Course Description**

Introduces the principles of ecology across an urban to wildland gradient and discusses how these landscapes can be sustainably managed. Explores basic ecological theories, plant communities, soil, climate, pollution, hydrology, and wildlife in classroom, labs, and field trips.

### **Duties and Requirements:**

Applicants must have a strong background in Pacific Northwest ecology including PNW plant identification, an understanding of ecological theory, and generally be interested in ecosystem science. The duties include collecting plant samples, helping to set up for each of the lab sessions, and assisting with field trips. The applicant must hold a valid driver's license in order to drive a UW vehicle during field trips. The applicant will also be required to complete a first aid/CPR certification course and a UW driver safety training course.

### **Pay:**

This hourly ASE position pays \$30.03 per hour during Spring Quarter 2025. You can expect to work an average of 15 hours per week, not to exceed 19.5 hours in any one week.
