Motion to grant Dean P. and Dan O. windsurf captain ratings

Discussion: Windsurf captain is a new rating. The first windsurf captain ratings must be granted.

Motion to grant Tanner G. performance dinghy ratings for i-14, 505, and 470.

Discussion: There are currently no rated members who can give this to Tanner. Tanner is a double-handed chief who has sailed these boats before. Tanner wants the rating to teach others on these lesser used boats.

Approved

Discussion: Proposal for removal of Rascal and Freedom by the Boat Disposal Committee.

Proposal 1 includes purchasing a trailer for Rascal & Freedom which will then be hauled out and towed to a scrapyard at an estimated cost of \$3,330. This is cheaper than sailing to a boatyard and having them do the complete disposal estimated at \$4,400.

• The trailer will also let us dispose of daysailers in the future. It can be stored for 1 year at a member's house.

Proposal 1a purchases a boat which comes with a trailer as this is typically cheaper than a stand-alone trailer. Then Rascal and Freedom will be hauled out and towed to a scrapyard as before.

- A Neptune 27 with trailer is used as an example.
- This boat could be kept for keelboat classes and to increase keelboat fee revenue.
- The WAC has asked us to downsize so keeping the boat may be inadvisable.
- Getting the boat+trailer as well as towing to a scrapyard is complicated and may have unforeseen issues.

Proposal 2 instead uses a boatyard for complete disposal of Rascal, then borrows a J/22 trailer and hauls out and tows Freedom to a scrapyard. The estimated cost is \$3,500.

- This would be simpler than buying a trailer and disposing of an extra boat.
- This plan will depend on our ability to borrow a trailer. The SYC trailer may not be available until spring.

We should ask CSR about free haulouts and about port townsends once a year free boat disposal program.

Conclusion: We should approve an expenditure for boat disposal, then later choose the disposal method depending on which appears most feasible and lowest cost. Considering factors such as if a J/22 trailer can be borrowed or if a suitable trailer can be purchased.

Motion to approve a \$6000 expenditure for the disposal of Rascal and Freedom:
